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

		<p>MusikMaker Free is a free full version music creator with which you can produce professional songs, immediately and without prior experience. In this video we'll show you how it's done.</p> <p>Download MusikMaker Free from the Magix website and install the program.</p> <p>When the program is launched the first time, a demo song opens. <b>Title:</b> Starting Music Maker	<b>Scene Number:</b> 3
<p><b>Screen:</b></p> 	<p><b>Narration:</b></p> <p>When the program is launched the first time, a demo song opens. Using this you can get a good idea how MusikMaker works.</p> <p>The demo song consists of different sound loops, which are in the arranger.</p>

<b>Title:</b> Start Working with Music Maker	<b>Scene Number:</b> 4
<p><b>Screen:</b></p> 	<p><b>Narration:</b></p> <p>If you click the 'Play' button or press the Space bar then you play the song.</p> <p>A play head moves from left to right.</p> <p>Loops which are above one another will be played together.</p> <p>In the right corner you can expand the view to see the other tracks. The free version offers eight tracks.</p> <p>Every track can be switched to Solo mode, then you can hear only the instrument that is on this track, or, you remove a track by muting it.</p> <p>To produce your own music, start with an empty arranger. Look for loops on the right side.</p> <p>First choose an instrument, and then a loop.</p> <p>You can preview every loop by clicking it.</p> <p>Simply drag the loops onto the tracks.</p> <p>You can preview new loops by clicking them with the mouse. You can do this without interrupting the playback. The loops will play automatically so that everything fits.</p> <p>If you want to insert a loop, press the Enter key.</p> <p>Melodic loops are offered in 7 tonal steps.</p> <p>You can shorten, move, or fade in and out any loop, for instance, to create a brake.</p> <p>If you finish a passage that you like to use again later in the song, select the loops and duplicate them by holding the CTRL key. You can quickly create a longer song by doing this.</p> <p>Now you can work in few variations, for example, by pausing the base and the drums, or, by inserting additional sounds.</p>

You find the instrument on the right in the Instruments panel. Instruments with an arrow symbol can be loaded and played immediately. The instrument's user interface will be open. You are able to test and adjust sounds here. Additionally a demo recording will load, so that you can hear how the instrument sounds. You can play the instruments with your computer keyboard or with a MIDI keyboard. To record your melody stop playback, and click on the red 'Record' button. At the end of a recording you can see it on the track.</p>

You open this by double clicking on a MIDI file (the loops). Here you can move the note, or delete it and draw in a new note.</p>

		<p>You can record live instruments or vocals using the recording function with a microphone.</p> <p>First, arm the track where you would like to record, then connect your microphone to the sound card or your PC and record.</p> <p>You can also edit or creatively distort your recordings, as well as the sound pool loops with effects.</p> <p>On the left switch the track to solo, so that you can hear it better.</p> <p>Open the Effect page by double clicking. Here you can find, for example, Reverb and an Echo.</p> <p>To adjust the effect's settings, click on its name.</p> <p>You can find other effects via the Plus icon.</p> <p>Finally switch off Solo Mode, so that you can hear the other instruments.</p> <p>That's all for this short introduction to Music Maker.</p> <p>But there is much more to discover.</p> <p>Have fun producing your own hits !</p>
